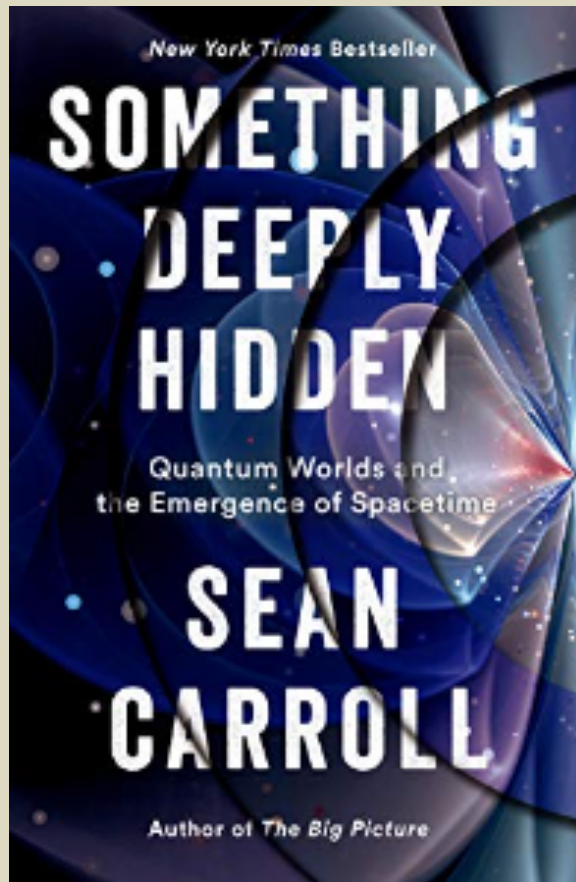
**This paper proposes to regard pure wave mechanics as a complete theory.**

the wavefunction of the universe  
is a set of interacting « parallel » universes



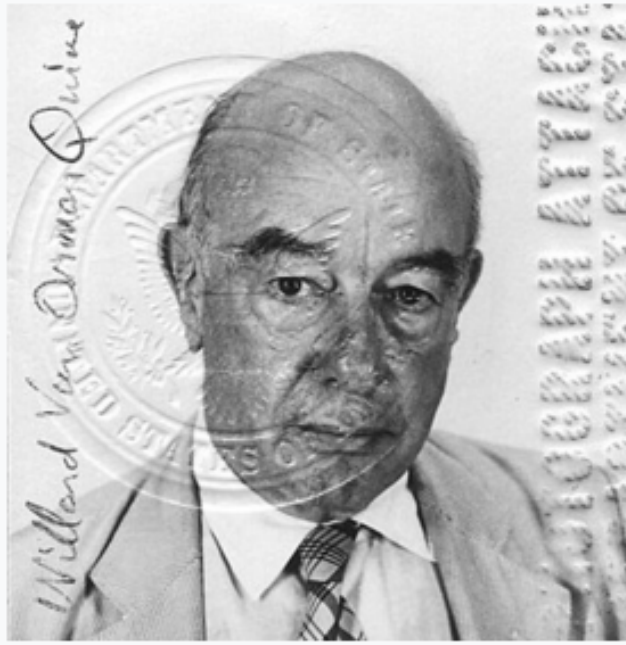
configurations of matter and energy  
on the past lightcone surfaces of parallel universes  
are macroscopically isomorphic  
and microscopically anisomorphic

is a set of interacting *elemental* universes

***an elemental universe is a Quine atom***

**a set which is its own sole element**

**it's not an abstract set**

**it's a concrete set**

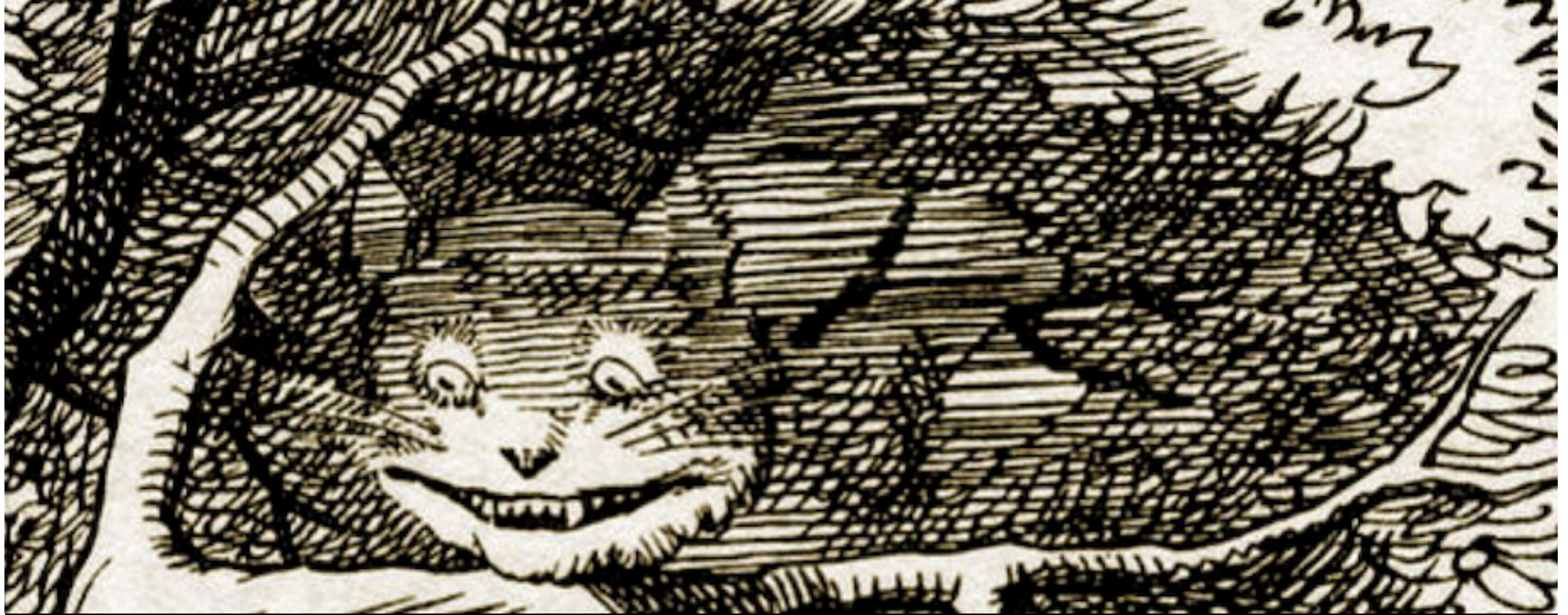
# Concrete Sets

the hypothesis

a set of Quine atoms has all and only  
the properties which its elements share  
other than those logically excluded

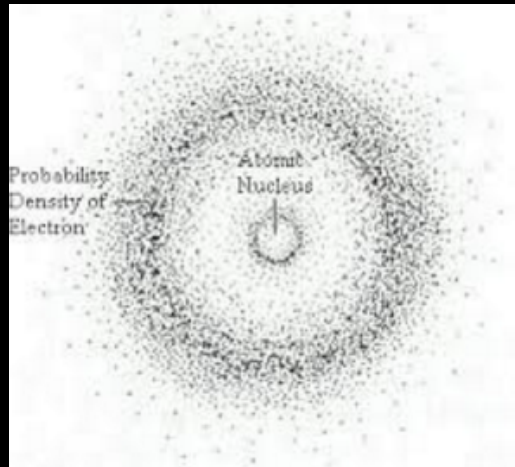
excluded properties include  
number of elements  
value-definiteness

sets of sets of Quine atoms are **abstract**

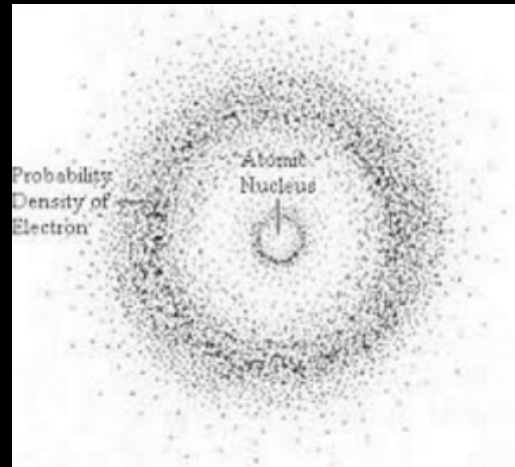


**a single *environmental* electron  
is a set of *elemental* electrons which are Quine atoms**

**each following a different trajectory  
in an *elemental* universe which is a Quine atom**

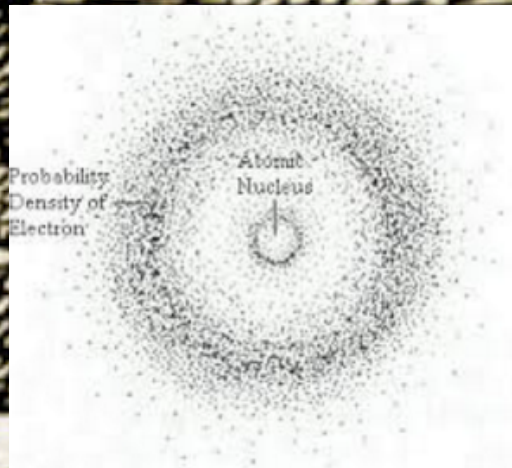


**an *environmental* electron cloud  
is a set of *elemental* electrons**



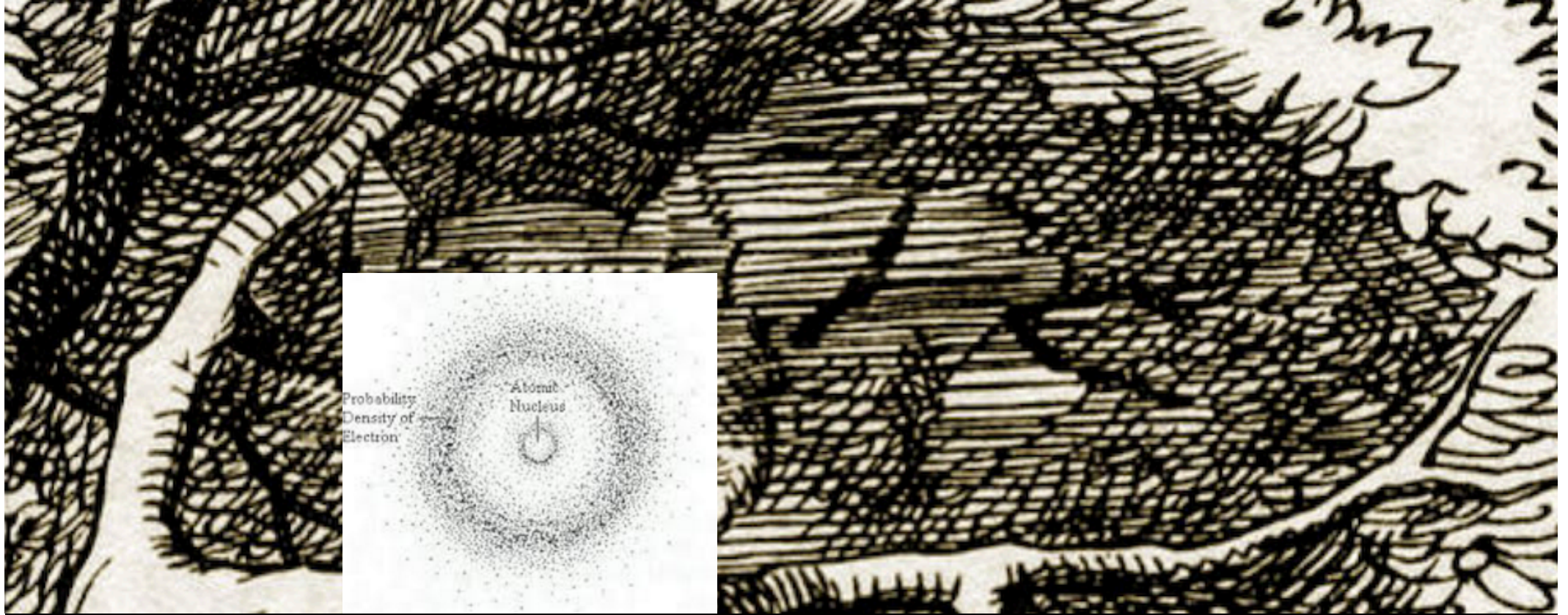
**probability density for a region in the cloud  
is a subset measure on the set of *elemental* universes  
which is the observer's universe**

**it's the measure of the subset of *elemental* universes where  
*elemental* electrons are located at parallel *elemental* regions**



**on measuring the cloud  
Alice splits into observers observing  
*environmental* electrons  
in different regions**

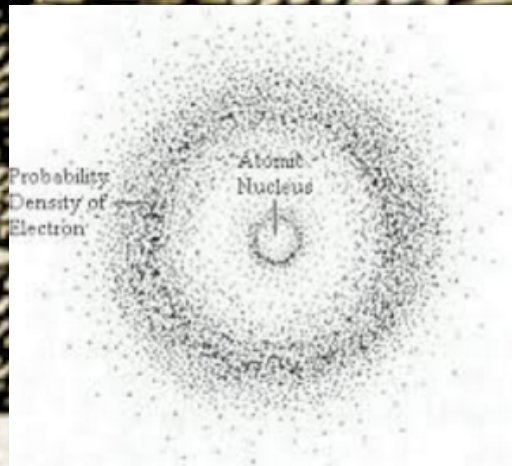




**she splits because her *environmental* body  
is a set of *elemental* bodies which partitions into subsets  
that are the *environmental* bodies of observers  
making different observations**







**the subset measure of each downstream Alice's universe relative to Alice's universe is the probability that Alice will be an observer observing an electron in each downstream region**
